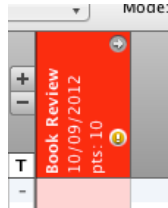
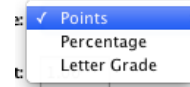


Visual Cues: Tying standards to assignments. What do they all mean?

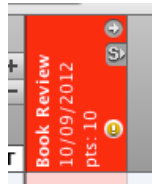


1. Under the Assignment Tab – create a new assignment.
2. Your score type will display after the creation date
3. The exclamation point in yellow informs you the assignment has NOT BEEN PUBLISHED.

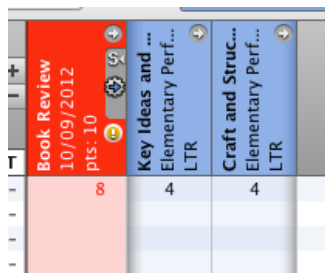
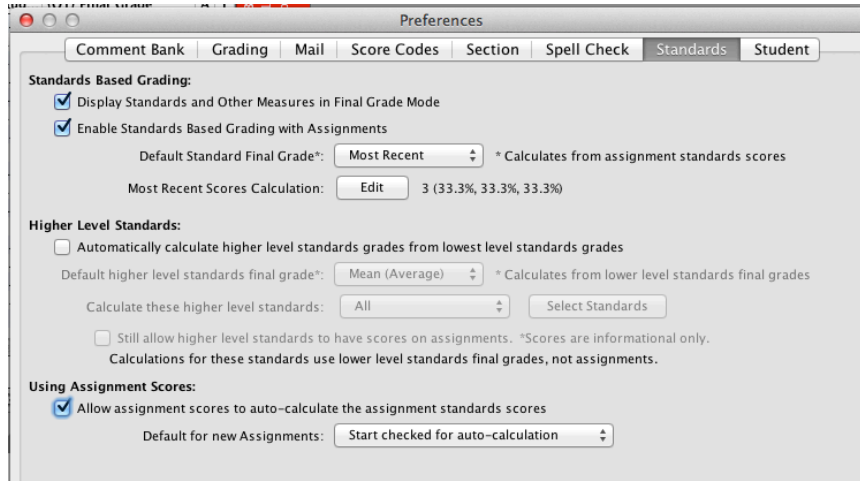


4. Select the Standards tab and check one or many individual standards that you want to associate to this new assignment.

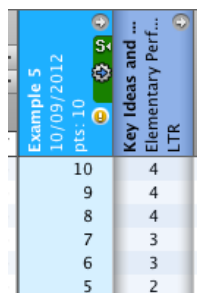

5. Once standards have been associated, your assignment will now display an "S" with a gray box around it. Clicking the S displays the standards as seen below in BLUE
6. If you want the assignment score to auto calculate to the standards, you must select this option under the Gradebook preferences and select the Standards tab as seen below.
7. ✓ the box under Using Assignment Score



8. Now a larger arrow with gears appears below the "S" informing that teacher that scores from assignments will auto calculate to standards.
9. As you begin to
10. As you begin to score the assignments, the Gradebook enlarges the gray



9. When you have completed the scoring all the students and those scores have auto calculated to the standards, the gray box around the S turns **GREEN**.
10. The Gradebook converts the assignment score to the standard score. If these conversions do not look correct, contact your PowerSchool Administrator as the "cut-off values on the grade and conversion scales may need to be reviewed.
